

### PUT THE VERBS IN THE CORRECT PAST TENSE FORMS.

Alice (1)\_\_\_\_\_ (begin) to get very tired of sitting by her sister on the bank, and of having nothing to do: once or twice she (2)\_\_\_\_\_ (peep) into the book her sister (3)\_\_\_\_\_ (read), but it had no pictures or conversations in it, 'and what is the use of a book,' (4)\_\_\_\_\_ (think) Alice 'without pictures or conversation?'

So she (5)\_\_\_\_\_ (consider) in her own mind (as well as she could, for the hot day (6)\_\_\_\_\_ (make) her feel very sleepy and stupid), whether the pleasure of making a daisy-chain would be worth the trouble of getting up and picking the daisies, when suddenly a White Rabbit with pink eyes (7)\_\_\_\_\_ (run) close by her.

There (8)\_\_\_\_\_ (be) nothing so very remarkable in that; nor did Alice think it so very much out of the way to hear the Rabbit say to itself, 'Oh dear! Oh dear! I shall be late!' (when she thought it over afterwards, it occurred to her that she ought to have wondered at this, but at the time it all seemed quite natural); but when the Rabbit actually took a watch out of its waistcoat-pocket, and (9)\_\_\_\_\_ (look) at it, and then (10)\_\_\_\_\_ (hurry) on, Alice (11)\_\_\_\_\_ (start) to her feet, for it (12)\_\_\_\_\_ (flash) across her mind that she (13)\_\_\_\_\_ (never before/see) a rabbit with either a waistcoat-pocket, or a watch to take out of it, and burning with curiosity, she (14)\_\_\_\_\_ (run) across the field after it, and fortunately (15)\_\_\_\_\_ (be) just in time to see it pop down a large rabbit-hole under the hedge.
